School Arrival and Dismissal Procedures

Parents dropping off and picking up students must pull into the driveway on the north side of the building. *The Thomas Avenue alley will be blocked off and may not be utilized for drop off and pick up.* We encourage drivers to be considerate of others by avoiding parking for extended periods of time in the loading and unloading zones. If it becomes necessary to park, please feel free to utilize the parking lot. Buses will load and unload students on the sidewalks along Roanoke (east side of the school). When students arrive, 6th and 7th graders will report to the gymnasium while 8th grade students will go to the cafeteria. Students will report to classes at 8:45 a.m. and begin eating breakfast in the classroom. Classes begin at 9:00 a.m. and school is over at 4:00p.m.

School Health Information

All 8th grade students must have a Tdap & Meningococcal immunization before you can attend school. If your student needs medication during the school year please fill out a medication administration form available at the school office/nurse's office. The medication must be brought to school in the original container with a label. The parent/guardian must deliver the medication to school. Students are not allowed to self-medicate while at school. If your student uses an inhaler the appropriate forms must be on file in the nurse's office. If your student has a medical condition, please contact Nurse Hanks at 523-6630.

Student Check Out Procedures

For the safety and security of our students, any time a student is checked out of school early they <u>must</u> be signed out in the office by a parent/guardian. Also, any person picking up a student <u>must</u> show I.D. This procedure will be strictly enforced. You must also be on the list to pick up your student.

Tardies to School and Class

Attending school regularly is important as is getting to school on time. With instructional time beginning at 9:00 a.m., tardies will be accounted for and consequences will incur as they accumulate. No exceptions will be made. When coming in after 9:00 USE the front doors only.

Bus Transportation

Bus transportation is provided to students living 1.5 miles or more from Jarrett. All questions regarding bus transportation should be directed to the School District Transportation Department at 523-0500. Parents should receive a note from transportation telling the bus pickup times and bus stop location before school starts. We plan to have a representative from transportation at the 7th and 8th grade schedule pickup and 6th grade orientation to answer questions.

Nutrition Services Information

All students will receive free daily breakfast in the classroom. This service will begin at 8:45 each day and end promptly at 857. Students will also have a daily 30 minute lunch break. A representative for nutrition services should be present at the 7th and 8th grade schedule pickup and 6th grade orientation to answer questions. Please go to sps.org and fill out the free and reduced app. Lunches are no longer free, you must qualify.
