Springfield Scholars Program

SCHOLARS HISTORY

1996 A group of seven 7th grade students and one teacher relocated from the WINGS full-time elementary program at Phelps to Central High School.

Over the past 25 years, enrollment and interest in the Scholars program has continued to increase. **2020** Currently, the Scholars program may serve up to 135 students in grades six through eight.

Each year, the number of applicants exceeds the number of alloted placements.

SCHOLARS COURSE CONTENT

Scholars students are enrolled in courses integrating the Major Instructional Goals (MIGs) of the district at a higher level and an accelerated pace.



Required:

English Language Arts/Social Studies Pre-Algebra or Algebra Science

Electives:

Choir, Band, Orchestra, PE/Health, or Art Foundations (Art = HS Credit)

In addition -All 6th grade Scholars core courses are located together, on the main floor, along with the Scholars office.

Required: Social Studies English Language Arts +Seminar/Learning Lab Four High School courses: **Earth Science Honors** Math (appropriate level) Foreign Language and/or other electives

Required: Humanities Philosophy +Learning Lab Five High School courses: **Physics First-Honors** Math (appropriate level) Foreign Language and/or other electives

Grading

Students receive grades for Scholars and high school classes.

Criteria for grades are provided at the beginning of each class.

Transcripts

Students are enrolled in Scholars and high school classes.

A letter explaining the Scholars program is included with transcripts sent out of district or on to colleges.

High school courses taken by students will be included in their high school

GPA

Weighted courses will count towards their freshman multiplier. These courses help determine class rank and GPA.

STUDY AND ORGANIZATIONAL SKILLS

Scholars students:

- are evaluated using the same standards as highschool students
- will have homework and should possess strong study and organizational skills

IMPORTANT CONSIDERATIONS

NOT WINGS

Scholars is not full-time WINGS in a different location.

NOT IB

Scholars is not a part of the International Baccalaureate Programme or a prerequisite for participation in IB.

NOT REGULAR MS

This experience is completely unique from the general middle school experience.

STRESS

The student (and family) must be able to handle stress as it relates to high academic expectations.

ACHIEVEMENT

Strong academic self-determination is critical for success in the Scholars program.

GPA

Again, there will be grades and credits that count towards a student's high school GPA and transcripts.

SELECTION CRITERIA AND FORMULA

Scholars Application for Consideration

- Assessments:
 - WISC-V x 2 (current within 12 months)
 - NNAT
 - SCAT
- Each applicant will attain a composite score based on the above information
- Score is used for placement

SELECTION TIMELINE

September 3: Application mailed to eligible 5th grade students

October 8: Application **DEADLINE** for 1st round consideration

Sept & Oct: Assessments (individual and small group)

November 23: Notification of selection by US mail

December 2: DUE DATE for prospective Scholars students

- Enrollment form
- Immediate Transfer submitted
- Shadow Day scheduled

DEADLINE for 2nd round applications

December 9: DROP DATE Placement forfeited if due date materials incomplete

The Springfield Scholars Program ("Scholars") is a full-time middle school program designed to identify and provide educational services for highly gifted students in grades 6-8. This accelerated academic experience provides students with the opportunity to pursue areas of strength in a high school setting. Students must qualify for gifted services and complete an application process to be eligible for participation. Scholars is located at Central High School, 423 E. Central St.
