



MISSOURI SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN (MSIP) 4th CYCLE REVIEW 2010-2011 SCHOOL YEAR

The Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary (DESE) completed its Missouri School Improvement Program (MSIP) 4th Cycle review of Springfield Public Schools (SPS) during the 2010-2011 school year. As a result of high performance on DESE's Annual Performance Report (APR), the district received a full MSIP waiver, which allowed the district to receive a limited/mini review for the 4th Cycle. The waiver rule establishes the criteria and procedure for annually identifying school districts and/or school buildings eligible for waivers in compliance with applicable state law and regulations.

The Springfield Public School District's 2010-2011 MSIP Waiver Review visit was conducted on March 3, 2011 by Dr. Dennis Cooper, DESE area state supervisor. The waiver review process involved the district demonstrating its compliance to the statutory requirements on the *Items Not Waived Checklist*. Prior to the official March 3rd visit, Dr. Cooper, along with the SPS executive directors for elementary, middle, and high schools, visited all district schools. The site visits included a conversation with the building principal as wells a tour of classrooms. Additionally, the district surveyed parents, students, faculty/staff, and members of the Board of Education using the MSIP 4th Cycle Advance Questionnaire. As a result of the visit, the district was fully accredited.

SPS also received the prestigious **Distinction in Performance Award** from DESE in 2011.

Springfield met 13 of 14 performance standards on the 2011 Annual Performance Report. The standards include student performance benchmarks which include MAP and ACT scores, attendance rates and graduation rates. The district received an additional point for "Bonus MAP Achievement," which is awarded based on the number of students demonstrating improvement on the MAP Test.

SPRINGFIELD PUBLIC SCHOOLS ACCOUNTABILITY PROCESS

Educational reform efforts over the past decade have highlighted the need for public education to produce and showcase quantifiable results on tests and other measures of achievement. Research literature indicates that educational performance is heightened when individuals understand what is to be measured and why. Such a process is commonly referred to as "accountability." An accountability process that measures progress is a good thing, but it cannot be an end unto itself—it must result in improvements. Research indicates customers of educational systems are interested in how students and schools are performing and improving and finding out what promotes student learning.

The accountability goal of the Springfield Public School District is to systematically set goals, define strategies to reach those goals, and monitor progress in achieving goals. The commitment of Springfield Public Schools to continuous improvement is reflected in the accountability process. A comprehensive accountability process provides continuous feedback to help school leaders systematically investigate which elements help school professionals and students perform more effectively.

The school district has three goals:

- 1. Improve student achievement: All students will demonstrate proficiency or higher in math, communication arts, and science.
- 2. Improve graduation rate: Students will persist in their effort to complete an educational program.
- 3. Ensure effective and efficient use of resources: High-quality, fiscally responsible services will be provided.

The district has also identified performance indicators critical to meeting district goals. These indicators help the district know what must be done to be considered successful by the public it serves. To accomplish this end, performance measurements have been established to ensure expectations are met. The performance measurements ensure the district commitment to continuous improvement.




