



# Pleasant View K-8 School

## Kindergarten Registration Fall 2023

**Our Kindergarten Registration Event for next school year  
will take place March 7-9, between 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.  
A child must be age 5 before August 1, 2023 to enter kindergarten next fall.**

There are two ways to enroll your future kindergartener. You may complete the paperwork online from home or come to Pleasant View on March 7, 8 or 9 between 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m..

On the Enrollment Application, please enter the FIRST, MIDDLE and LAST names for both the student and guardians and answer every question even if the answer is no. Also, please make sure to click the "Add Contact" button to enter information on all guardians. A guardian is considered the mother, father, or legal guardian. Emergency contacts are anyone allowed to sign your student out from school, example: grandparent, aunt, uncle, friend, etc. In order for someone to be allowed to pick up your student from school or eat lunch with them, they must be listed as either a guardian or emergency contact.

If your child currently attends a SPS early childhood program, it is not necessary to enroll them online as they are already in our system as active students, but we do ask that you contact our office.

You may fill out the online application at home or parents/guardians may fill out the application online at Pleasant View March 7, 8 or 9 between the hours of 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

2. Complete the Health Inventory Form included in this packet.

3. Complete the document collection portion of enrollment. You will need to provide ALL of the following documents:

- \*Child's Birth Certificate
- \*Child's Immunization Record
- \*Proof of Residency (utility bill or real estate contract)
- \*Registering Adults Driver's License
- \*Completed Health Inventory

You can provide these documents through a variety of methods:

- Upload during the online enrollment process

- Bring to the school and have them copied.

## **Is your child prepared?**

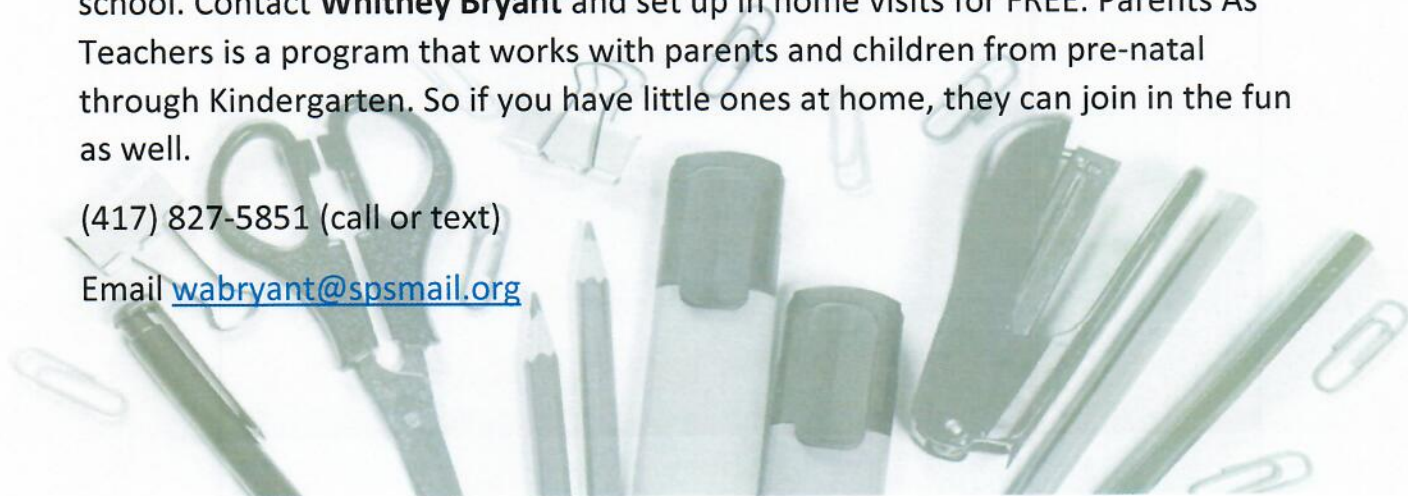

### **Welcome Blue Jays!**

My name is Nurse Brooke and this letter has information regarding health policies for SPS. As your child attends school there might be times I need to contact you, please always have the most current phone number on file with the office staff. If I am unable to reach you, I will reach out to the teacher about classroom communication or leave a voicemail. As always you may contact me by phone or email. Email is the fastest way to reach me. I look forward to a healthy and happy year.

### **Health Care Policy Reminders:**

Fever / Vomiting / Diarrhea: A student should not be in attendance and will be sent home from school if temperature (orally) is 100.4 degrees or more. If a student is sent home for any of the above conditions they should stay home one full day after or until symptoms are cleared. In addition, students must be free of above symptom(s) without administration of any fever reducing medications or other medication to relieve symptom(s) for at least 24 hours before returning to school.

Strep Throat: Students may return to school after 24 hours from the first antibiotic dose, and when they have been fever free for 24 hours.

Pinkeye: Students may return when there is no longer crusting or drainage from the eye when they wake up, AND it has been 24 hours after the first dose of antibiotic OR if they have a note from a doctor.

Communicable Diseases: Any disease that can be spread person to person in the community or school setting must remain at home until the contagious period has expired. Please call the school nurse with any questions regarding this matter as protocols are always changing.

If you are unsure if you should send your child to school, call me and I can help you make a decision. If possible, medications should be given at home. If medicine (prescription or over the counter) is needed to be given during the school day, an adult is required to bring the medicine to the health room, complete the form(s), and visit with the nurse.

***\*\*\*Please complete the Student Health Inventory so I have the most current health and contact information for your child. If a child is diagnosed or started on medication during the school year, the school nurse should be notified. My top priority is to keep your child safe.***
