Kindergarten Registration Fall 2024

**Our Kindergarten Registration Event for next school year
will take place March 4-7, between 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.
A child must be age 5 before August 1, 2024 to enter kindergarten next fall.**

There are two ways to enroll your future kindergartener. You may complete the paperwork online from home or come to Pleasant View on March 4, 5, 6, or 7 between 9:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m.

1. Fill Out the Online Enrollment Application at sps.org/pleasantview

On the Enrollment Application, please enter the FIRST, MIDDLE and LAST names for both the student and guardians and answer every question even if the answer is no. Also, please make sure to click the "Add Contact" button to enter information on all guardians. A guardian is considered the mother, father, or legal guardian. Emergency contacts are anyone allowed to sign your student out from school, example: grandparent, aunt, uncle, friend, etc. In order for someone to be allowed to pick up your student from school or eat lunch with them, they must be listed as either a guardian or emergency contact.

If your child currently attends a SPS early childhood program, it is not necessary to enroll them online as they are already in our system as active students, but we do ask that you contact our office.

You may fill out the online application at home or parents/guardians may fill out the application online at Pleasant View March 4, 5, 6, or 7 between the hours of 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

2. Complete the Health Inventory Form included in this packet.

3. Complete the document collection portion of enrollment. You will need to provide ALL of the following documents:

*Child's Birth Certificate

*Child's Immunization Record

*Proof of Residency (utility bill or real estate contract)

*Registering Adults Driver's License

*Completed Health Inventory

You can provide these documents through a variety of methods:

- Upload during the online enrollment process
- Email to jmgott@spsmail.org
- Bring to the school and have them copied.

Has your child received a developmental screening?

My name is Brooke Turner and I am the School Nurse here at Pleasant View. If your child needs to take medication at school or has any special health concerns, please do not hesitate to contact me or stop by the Health Office. My goal is to keep students at school, as safe as possible, so they can be healthy and effective learners, while promoting independence with self-care and healthy habits.

If you are unsure if you should send your child to school or not, call me and I can help you decide.

Health Care Policy Reminders:

- Fever:** 100.4 degrees and greater. The student may return to school when they have had **NO FEVER FOR 24 HOURS** without using Tylenol or Motrin to lower their temperature.
- Vomiting/Diarrhea:** Students may return to school when they have not vomited or had loose stools for 24 hours.
- Strep throat:** Students may return to school after 24 hours from the first antibiotic dose; and when they have been fever free for 24 hours.
- Pinkeye:** Students may return when there is no longer crusting or drainage from the eye when they wake up, AND it has been 24 hours after the first dose of antibiotic OR if they have a note from a doctor.
- Head Lice:** Students must be free of head lice and nits.
- Medication:** If possible, medications should be given at home. If medicine (prescription or over the counter) is needed to be given during the school day, an **adult** is required to bring the medicine to the health room, complete the form(s), and visit with the nurse. *Over the Counter Medication* (Tylenol/Ibuprofen/ etc.) a physician's note is REQUIRED after the 3rd dose. Please contact your doctor and have the orders ready.
