2017-18 Season Recap: It was a historic season for Parkview capturing the first boys District Championship in 28 years with an 86-78 victory over city rival Glendale! It was a season full of highlights, big wins, tough losses, and plenty of adversity. The team showed great resilience all year by continuing to believe in each other and working hard in practices to get better every day. After struggling with injuries all year and trying to find a rhythm, things clicked at the right time for a talented team with high expectations. Parkview entered the Class 5 District 11 tournament as the #4 seed. A 63-50 first round win over Branson set up a match-up with #1 seed and district host Ozark. Trailing by 13 points to start the 4th quarter the Vikings battled back and outscored the Tigers 31-16 in the final qtr. to take a 76-74 victory in the district semi-final. An upset of #2 seed Glendale gave Parkview it's first Championship since 1990. In the MSHSAA Sectional at Drury University, Parkview was matched with the Joplin Eagles. In front of an electric high school basketball atmosphere, led by 27 points from standout junior Tyem Freeman, Parkview pulled out a 63-55 victory. The win over Joplin advanced the Vikings to the State Quarterfinals against the #2 state-ranked (27-1) Columbia Rock Bridge Bruins. A gutsy effort and career-best performances from underclassmen Anthony Green and Nakai Johnson kept the game close all night. In the end Parkview would fall 51-60 to a talented Bruins team. Seniors Daru Elliott and Damarcus Mason both played great games to end their high school careers, representing Parkview proudly. There is plenty to be excited about for the upcoming season. With three returning starters and several returning letter winners, the 2018-19 season looks to be promising!
